## **\*\*For Awards to be presented at the NEMSA Winter Conference**

### **Leo J O'Brien, Jr. Award**

This award is presented for outstanding Achievements that an individual has attained or accomplished in the emergency medical field. The deadline for this award is January 1, of the current year, or bring to the NEMSA Winter Conference before 1pm Saturday.

### **Hero Award**

This award is presented for outstanding achievements in the emergency care field that promote sound principles of emergency care and warrant the person being called a hero. The deadline for this award is January 1, of the current year, or bring to NEMSA Conference before 1pm on Saturday.

## **\*\*For awards to be presented at the NEMSA Spring Conference** **Nominator & Nominee must be a Current NEMSA Member**

### **NEMSA EMT of the Year Award**

Awarded to the EMT who has demonstrated outstanding skills, training and services to their community and/or State of Nebraska. The deadline for this award is March 1, of the current year, or bring to NEMSA Conference before 5pm on Friday.

### **NEMSA Paramedic of the Year Award**

Awarded to the EMT Paramedic who has demonstrated outstanding skills, training and service to their community and/or State of Nebraska. The deadline for this award is March 1, of the current year, or bring to NEMSA Conference before 5pm on Friday.

### **Chuck Woll Memorial NEMSA Instructor of the Year Award**

This award is given to the EMS Instructor who has made the greatest contribution to local, state or national EMS as an instructor. The person must be an instructor for a Nebraska Department of Health approved program providing on-going training for EMT-B, EMT-I or EMT-P personnel. The deadline for this award is March 1, of the current year, or brings to NEMSA Conference before 5pm on Friday.

## **\*\*Nomination Form for Nebraska EMS Association Hall of Fame**

Nominations may be submitted at any time during the calendar year. This is not an annual award and may be given to several recipients or not at all during the calendar year.

An awardee does not have to be an actual provider. They can be a spouse, political figure, etc. One who has been a steadfast supporter of individual providers, services or the profession as a whole. An awardee can be a provider of any level from a first responder to paramedic, nurse or physician. There is no year of service requirement.

The individual must have made a significant impact on their individual service, statewide EMS or variety of services in their area or region. Some examples of this are direct patient care, quality assurance/improvement, training, professionalism, CISM, community awareness/education, legislation, political action, medical direction. An awardee can be an individual who has made significant contributions to the education of EMS providers through time, dedication and the amount of involvement with classes, Hall of Fame award may be presented posthumously.

Award will be presented at Nebraska EMS Conferences.
